2020 Census Counts on the Arts

The NC Counts Coalition's Art Counts Mural Project, supported by John Rex Endowment and in partnership with the City of Raleigh, unveiled nine murals in hard to count tract areas throughout the city. The first mural was unveiled during the "Count NC Kids Week of Action" across the sidewalk at the Hillsborough St. YMCA. The youngest artist, an 11-year-old girl, was inspired to draw this because she wanted to raise awareness of the importance of counting kids in the 2020 Census. The other eight murals were recently unveiled on city buses, at the Raleigh train station, park walls, and buildings around Raleigh.

\$1.5 Million Dollars for 2020 Census Engagement in WNC

Dogwood Health Trust, serving Western North Carolina (WNC), has allocated \$1.5 million dollars for 2020 Census outreach and engagement. In an effort to ensure strong community participation that will hopefully result in increased federal dollars brought back into the region, Dogwood Health Trust is actively partnering with almost all of the 18 Western North Carolina counties as well as a growing number of community nonprofit organizations to reach communities that have been historically undercounted while increasing participation in the 2020 Census.

Dogwood Health Trust is providing participating WNC counties and the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians with an incentive of \$1,000 for every full percentage point increase in 2020 Census self-reporting beginning June 26 until the counting timeframe ends, with a 30-point cap. Minigrants of up to \$2,500 are also available to each county to assist with their Census marketing and outreach efforts.

Dogwood Health Trust also seeks to work with nonprofit partner organizations that have the networks to activate and mobilize Census participation. Partner organizations that can communicate directly with individual households will earn a \$10/per person incentive. Dogwood Health Trust is a wonderful 2020 census partner, working tirelessly to ensure everyone in Western North Carolina is counted.



Cooperative Extension Continues to Share Census Information

The North Carolina Cooperative Extension in Tyrrell and Hyde Counties has been a wonderful 2020 Census partner and recently continued their efforts to promote the Census during the Rural Week of Action held from August 2nd to 8th. They have hosted three Mobile Questionnaire Assistance (MQA) events in three different counties, as well as two caravan parades through low responding areas and back-to-school give-aways.

The North Carolina Cooperative Extension in Tyrrell and Hyde Counties continues to feature census reminders and other information on their website and across each of their social media platforms. Face-to-face community engagement at food pantry and programming sites include 2020 census messaging as well.


