Halifax County Senior Nutrition Services:

Halifax County Schools

- Mondays and Wednesdays
- Sheetz: Kidz Meal Bagz is a program providing free meals to help children and families in need as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. Meals will be available all day, at all 600 Sheetz locations, starting Thursday, April 16th and will include a turkey sandwich, chips and a drink. Families interested in taking advantage of the free Kidz Meal Bagz program should go to a Sheetz location and ask an employee at the register for a meal. Families will be offered one bag per child. Meals will be available daily while supplies last.

- <u>Text for Food</u>: North Carolina Governor Roy Cooper announced that parents who need food help can text FOODNC to 877-877 to locate nearby free meal sites. The service, which is also available in Spanish by texting COMIDA to 877-877, will allow parents to enter their address, then receive a text with the location and serving times for nearby pick-up free meal sites. The sites are set up for children ages 18 and younger, including pre-school kids, who rely on free and reduced-price meals at school.

 Essential workers can now apply for emergency child care subsidy by submitting the COVID-19 Parent Application for Financial Assistance for Emergency Child Care to their child care provider. Unemployment

- North Carolina Unemployment Insurance Program:
 - After filing a claim, it will take about 14 days to receive first payment. The additional \$600 in federal benefits will be for weeks ending April 4 – July 31. DES is awaiting guidance for issuing those payments. Benefits owed will be paid retroactively. (via NC Department of Commerce on 3/30/2020)
 - Our customer call center is experiencing high call volume. The fastest and most efficient way to file a claim is online. Create an account, file a claim and get the latest information here: https://des.nc.gov/need-help/covid-19-nc-unemployment-insurance-information.

State/Federal Benefits

- <u>Health Insurance</u>:
 - Visit healthcare.gov.
 - o It will tell you if you can enroll in a private plan or if you qualify for assistance
- Pandemic Electronic Benefit Transfer (P-EBT) program
 - This will help NC families purchase food for children impacted by #COVID19NC school closings.
 - Families whose children are eligible for free and reduced lunch at school will receive \$250 in P-EBT benefits per child, with the possibility of additional benefits if schools are closed beyond 5/15.
 - o Families do NOT need to apply.
 - o This will be paid in 2 installments with federal dollars.
 - o Current Food and Nutrition Services (FNS) recipients will receive this benefit on their EBT card.
 - P-EBT families not enrolled in FNS will be mailed a new EBT card within the next few weeks.
 - Benefits will roll out soon
- <u>USDA</u> intends to use all available program flexibilities and contingencies to serve our program participants across our 15 nutrition programs. We have already begun to issue

- waivers to ease program operations and protect the health of participants. To see approved COVID-19 Waivers & Flexibilities in North Carolina, please visit https://www.fns.usda.gov/disaster/pandemic/covid-19/north-carolina.
- <u>SNAP</u>: If you already receive help buying food through Food and Nutrition Services (FNS), the NC Department of Health and Human Services has received permission to enhance your benefits during the COVID-19 pandemic. All families that receive FNS will receive the maximum amount allowed for March 2020 and April 2020 for their household size. - Executive Order 124 (March 31) prohibits utilities including electric, gas, water and
 wastewater services from disconnecting people who are unable to pay during this
 pandemic and prohibits them from collecting fees, penalties or interest for late payment.
 The order applies for the next 60 days and gives residential customers at least six months to
 pay outstanding bills.
- IRS:
 - <u>Tax Deadline Changed</u>: The deadlines to FILE and PAY federal income taxes are extended to July 15, 2020.
 - <u>Economic Impact Payments</u>: To check on the status of your Economic Impact Payment, visit https://www.irs.gov/coronavirus/get-my-payment.
